

Sulevi Riukulehto works as Research Director in Regional History and Cultural Heritage at the University of Helsinki Ruralia Institute, Finland. He received his Doc. of Phil. in 1998 in the University of Jyväskylä. He was appointed as Adjunct Professor in Economic History in 2005 in the University of Jyväskylä and in 2018 as Extraordinary Professor of social transformation in the School of Social Sciences at the Vaal Triangle Campus of the North-West University (SA).

At the University of Helsinki Riukulehto leads the research group of Regions, History and Culture, which focuses on the development processes of regions and structures, regional history, and cultural phenomena in the rural context. He has been the responsible leader of 32 research projects.

Riukulehto's latest publications deal with questions of rural housing and the experiential theory of home. He is the main author of more than 20 books, including *A House Made to Be a Home* (CSP 2016) and *Between Time and Space* (CSP 2015), *The Great Ostrobothnian Peasant Houses* (Univ. of Helsinki 2016) and *The Concepts of Luxury and Waste in American Radicalism, 1880–1929* (The Finnish Academy of Science and Letters, 1998).

Riukulehto is a member of editorial board in *Finnish Journal of Rural Studies*, *Maaseutututkimus* and *New Contree. A Journal of Historical and Human Sciences for Southern Africa*.
