Joseph Ben Prestel is Marie Sklodowska-Curie Fellow at Roskilde University and lecturer in history at Freie Universität Berlin. His research and teaching focus on modern global and urban history with an emphasis on the entangled histories of Europe and the Middle East. His first book *Emotional Cities: Debates on Urban Change in Berlin and Cairo, 1860-1910* was published with Oxford University Press, in 2017. It examines the parallel rise of arguments about specifically urban emotions in Berlin and Cairo during the second half of the nineteenth century. An Arabic translation of the book was published, in 2024. Joseph's current research analyzes the rise and fall of a solidarity movement with Palestinians in West Germany, between the 1950s and the 1980s. An article that stems from this research was published in *The American Historical Review* (September 2022 issue) with the title "A Diaspora Moment: Writing Global History Through Palestinian-West German Ties." Joseph has received fellowships from the Max Planck Society, the American University in Cairo, the University of Cambridge, the Orient Institut Beirut, Princeton University, and the University of Jyväskylä.
